School Bus Driver

Role Summary

School bus driving is steady, community-based work with a predictable rhythm. Each day centres around safely moving students between home and school while maintaining a calm, structured environment on the bus. The role suits people who value routine, reliability, and local work that fits around the rest of their life.

You are responsible for more than just driving. You set the tone on the bus. Students respond to consistency, and schools rely on drivers who show up on time, follow procedures, and keep things orderly without making the job complicated. It is straightforward work when done well, but it carries real responsibility.

What the job looks like

Most days begin with a pre-trip inspection followed by a morning route. You will operate an assigned route, manage safe stops, and ensure proper loading and unloading at each location. Afternoon routes mirror the morning. Between runs, you may have several hours free. Some drivers keep that time open; others take on additional trips when available.

Optional work can include:

- Field trips and activity runs
- Sports team transportation
- Occasional charter support

These are available but not required.

Core responsibilities

- Safely operate a school bus on a consistent daily route
- Complete required pre-trip and post-trip inspections
- Maintain safe loading and unloading procedures
- Keep a calm, controlled environment on the bus
- Communicate clearly with dispatch and school contacts
- Report mechanical issues or route concerns promptly
- Follow established safety and operational procedures

What we're looking for

- Reliable, punctual individuals with a steady presence
- Class 2 licence with air brake endorsement (or willingness to train)
- Clean driver's abstract
- Criminal record check with vulnerable sector clearance
- Ability to manage student behaviour calmly and consistently
- Comfort driving in rural and winter conditions

Experience helps, but attitude and reliability matter more. Training is available for the right candidates.

- Home every day

- Route-based pay with optional extra work
